

Water Wells

How many of us turn on the tap and let the water run, as we brush our teeth? What a luxury! Many people do not even have running water to drink! Over the last year, AH has stepped up its water well project by partnering with other organizations to bring pure and clean water to villages in Africa and other countries. AH has embarked on the more elaborate water wells costing from \$4,000 to \$15,000 each. In addition to providing water to these villages, AH has provided life-saving water wells to many people in Afghanistan, Somalia, Tanzania, Sudan, Gambia, Kenya and other poor villages. There has been little or no rain

in most of these countries which has resulted in a drought. In the horn of Africa there's an estimated 1.5 million displaced families and 10 million people that are in need of immediate food and clean water. The Prophet (S) encouraged believers to give water to those in need for it is sadaqah jaariyah (continuous charity). We do not need to sponsor an entire well, please donate whatever you can to provide a basic necessity to those who are suffering. The next time we turn on a tap to use water, think of all the people who can only wish and hope for such luxury.



- \$15 you can provide 1,000 liters of water

Syria, Gaza & Yemen

As the conflicts escalate in these countries, AH is seeking your Zakaah to ease the sufferings of our brothers and sisters. They are displaced, injured, killed and orphaned. The children are the ones losing the battle. Thirst and hunger are our primary focus to combat. AH partners with other organizations to deliver clothing kits, food packages, hygiene kits, tents and tarps. We target health care, nutrition, sanitation and education. In the past, AH financed a truckload of flour for bakeries to bake breads, hygiene kits, tents and mobile houses for displaced refugees of Syria. We can only continue to do this type of work with your contributions and Zakaah so please donate generously.

Sister & Her Family Stranded – AH to the Rescue

Imagine arriving in the USA with 4 children expecting to meet your husband at the airport but he was not there. This was the case of a sister arriving from Pakistan. AH heard of her plight and came to her rescue immediately. The sister and her children had to live in a room and share a kitchen with other tenants. After 2 weeks, she was told to move out. With no money it was difficult for her. AH assisted her financially to resettle in a good apartment. AH bought all the school supplies for the children to start school. On a follow-up call to check on this family, we found the 10 year old son was home on a school day. He said that his class went on a trip and he did not have the money to pay for it. AH promised him that in the future we will pay for his school trips. At this time, he told us that his mother, (even with her limited English) found a part time job. AH will stay with her until she is fully independent. Please partner with us to see her through this hardship and assure her and her children that together she will overcome this trial. This sister is utilizing your Zakaah to uplift her unfortunate condition.

From Homelessness to the Workforce

Two of AH volunteers in Florida were driving and saw a sister in Hijab walking in a lonely street. She had her shoes in her hands. They stopped to inquire if she is okay. At first, she said that the shoes were too small and blistering her feet. Later, she confessed that she lived in the Muslim Women's Shelter and was on her way to the Masjid seeking solace and guidance. Unfortunately, she could not live in the shelter for more than six months. AH made a commitment to support her through her struggles, not only financially but to provide her with socioemotional support that she so desperately needed. Our volunteers took her shopping for basic necessities and clothing for job interviews. She went to a few interviews and, Al Hamdu lillah, she was promised employment at a vacation resort. AH is providing her with financial, emotional and moral support with the hope that with her small income, she will be able to move into her own apartment. Insha Allah, AH will continue to support her until she is settled. Please stay with us, so that together, we can bring her home.

Burial Assistance

Self-Sufficiency-Skill Training

In dispensing its Zakaah and Sadaqah, one of the major objectives of AH is to build capacity and self-sufficiency among our recipients. In Cambodia, AH sewing school "Golden Needle" is providing professional training classes for the youths and unemployed. After graduation, many of the students are gainfully employed by factories as seamstresses and tailors. Many of our past students have moved onto neighboring countries seeking better employment with promising garment industries. They can now provide for themselves and families.



Changing Lives for the Better

AH volunteer in Guyana discovered a poor couple with their seven children struggling to make ends meet although they are making use of every opportunity presented to them. They wanted to make their living and not be dependent on charity and as such, they are seeking a way out of their struggles. Your donation helped them to realize this dream of Self-Sufficiency. AH purchased the goods needed for the wife to start a small business selling fruits, pastries & candies in front of a school. The husband in the meantime is trying to build a leather craft business. The wife and her seven children are learning the trade. Today by your assistance, Al Hamdu lillah they are taking care of their everyday living expenses. Sadly, they still need a secure house in which to live. They are on the AH Build-A-New House waiting list. This house is not a luxury but a humble, decent place to call home. It is a fulfilling feeling knowing that your Zakaah is given to those who are willing to make progress in their lives, and not become dependent on charity. Please donate generously to help this dedicated family on their final journey towards a better life.

AH provides burial assistance to those who cannot afford burial expenses for their deceased relatives. This service is done in the USA, Cambodia and Guyana. These are times when many are feeling the pains of a lost one, but by alleviating the stress of burial expenses brings a sigh of relief to the poor. Allah will relieve the pain of a person on the Day of Judgment for the one who relieves the pain of someone in this world.

Education

Knowledge is the light that will illuminate the heart. We have to utilize the power of knowledge to wipe away ignorance, spread love and share the beauty of Islam with others. We live in times of turbulence. It is knowledge and its sound application with love and wisdom that will help weather the storm. AH has been giving financial support to dedicated students committed to their studies. These students' aim is to be the source of knowledge and counsel their communities so they can grow and strive to be shining examples. AH is paying the salaries to the Hafizh who are teaching Quran memorization in the several Darul Ulooms in Guyana and Cambodia.





AH in its mission of instilling the need to improve lives, has placed emphasis on the teaching and learning of the Qur'an. Much attention and support are given to these schools in the countries where AH has established its operations. One such school is Riyad al-Jannah located in one of the poorest and most notorious neighborhoods in Georgetown, Guyana. It has over 80 full time students. It operates six different sessions from as early as 5:00 AM to 9:00 PM at night and caters for students juggling academic and religious studies, especially Qur'an memorization. This school began with concerned parents homeschooling their daughters who eventually excelled academically and have become the first 2 Girls to memorize the entire Qur'an in

Guyana. The students excelled at Qur'an competition in Guyana, Caribbean and Dubai. Riyad al-Jannah has become the premier Qur'an memorization school where parents are vying to enroll their children. The curriculum now features Islamic subjects and career guidance in marriage, leadership and interpersonal skills. It also offers specialized sports activities. Riyad al-Jannah employs 7 teachers and 3 assistants and serves hundreds of part time students. AH is providing financial assistance to Riyad al-Jannah for its monthly operational expenses.

AH is on a journey to make Qur'an an integral part of children's lives in Guyana, Bangladesh, Cambodia and Africa. We continue to support Qur'an schools in these countries. Teachers, students and other support staff are given monthly stipends. AH provides personal hygiene hampers for the students. The schools are given assistance for operating expenses. In Bangladesh AH has been a leader in assisting blind students for Qur'an memorization and 250 orphans. In Guyana, AH is supporting 4 of these schools. Please continue to donate for the Qur'an memorization, the rewards to you is enormous.





Listen To Her Silent Cry

Every girl dreams of growing up, getting married, and having a family. She dreams of sitting at the dinner table with her husband and children happily eating the delicious meal she cooked. She does not dream of her husband coming home drunk, yelling at her about dinner, and hitting her. She does not dream of cradling her children, trying to protect them from their father. She does not dream of staying up all night and wondering if tonight will be her last night on earth because he may follow through on his threats to kill her.

Domestic violence is a real and dangerous problem for women around the world. According to the latest statistics, 70 percent of women worldwide will experience abuse by an intimate partner during their lifetime. 10 million children are exposed to domestic violence every year. It is incredibly difficult for these women to leave their abusive relationships. Furthermore, 98 percent experience financial abuse, which is the number one reason women stay or return to the abusive relationship. The abuser controls their money supply, leaving them with no financial resources to break free. These women are trapped in their situations often having no one to help them. Al Hamdu lillah, we at AH extends our tender hands to their cries and feelings of hopelessness. We treat all the cases with confidentiality, most of all giving them the comfort that Allah will heal their wounds and that we are here to help them through their trials. We listened to their plight, give counsel and refer them to professional help. It does not end here. A volunteer is assigned to each case until the family recuperates and feel safe to go on living. For decades, Amaana Hands has been helping women and

For decades, Amaana Hands has been helping women and their children survive their whirlwind of turmoil. About 14 years ago, AH began to significantly help 5 orphans who were left in care of their elderly grandmother. Their father murdered their mother in their presence. The father was imprisoned for life. It is painful to retell this story, much less these orphans that are scarred with this pain of losing their mother. Al Hamdu lillah, your caring response of Zakaah & Sadaqah have been helping these orphans since then. AH built them a house, provided them our Monthly Food Hampers and supported them in their educational needs. We are their parents that answer their calls even on weekends. These orphans are all grown now and dream of creating a new life for themselves.

One of the daughters is now married. She was overjoyed to find a husband, who promised to love and take care of

her. She has two adorable children. She finally thought that she would have the life she dreamt of. However, her dreams turned into nightmares, when her husband began to abuse her. He once beat her so badly in the ribs that she is now left with permanent breathing problems. She is scared to leave him as she fears that he will kill her. He has been arrested several times but always returns home and promises to stop. He believes that because she has no one to help her or nowhere to go, he can continue to mistreat her. She prays every day to Allah for help for her children and herself. Poverty is compounded with her abuse. She reached out to our local AH Coordinator. He went to the Police Precinct on her behalf. He also gave counsel to the husband. AH is helping this Sister and pray that Allah will relieve her distress setting her life to the path of ease.

Our Sister Needs Two Prosthetic Arms

Another domestic violence case occurred a few years ago that is too brutal to report. This sister lost her two arms as she tried to protect herself when her husband came after her with a weapon. Sadly, she could not save the lives of her two children from their father's violent crime. AH is currently making contacts with the medical institutions in the USA to get her two prosthetic arms that we will send to her. Al Hamdu lillah, she is now remarried and is in a happy and kind relationship. Poverty still prevails, as her husband is a laborer struggling to upkeep his family. AH field worker reported that their living condition is sad. This couple were given a small piece of land from the Government. It will cost \$7,000. for AH to build a small house. All housing recipients are thoroughly interviewed before they are qualified. We pray that our acts of kindness earn us a house in Jannatul Firdous, Aameen.

We may not be able to remove the scars and pain but we can help them break free from the abusive relationships and prevent future abuse. Domestic violence can be stopped with your intervention of care, love and support.

A Way Out!

Recently, a sister who was facing a domestic violence situation here in the USA sought help after repeatedly being abused and beaten by her husband. The hospital called the local Muslim Women's Shelter and a bulletin was sent out for help to house the sister and her child. With your Zakaah, AH responded immediately and gave the financial assistance needed to provide housing for this sister and her child. Sadly, many of our sisters are in similar situations. Encourage those who are being mistreated to speak up and seek help. A believer does not despair. We have our obligations to those who are oppressed and cannot turn away from their plight. We live in a country where spousal abuse is not dealt with lightly. Please let's be reminded to make du'a for these families.

Medical Assistance

A brother from Guyana came to the USA for a prosthetic leg. The cost of the leg was \$13,000. Al Hamdu lillah, it is with your Zakaah that AH gave a generous payment directly to the clinic. This brother is now on his way to recovery. Thanks for helping him back on his feet, literally.

An Orphan - Sima's Heart Surgery



Sima is 8 years old. She lost her father at age 2. She was born with a heart defect. Sima is one of the Muslim orphans that we care for in Cambodia. On May 11th 2015 was her surgery. After a few days in ICU, she was discharged. Sadly, in Cambodia if the patient cannot

pay the doctors and nurses they are discharged. It is with your Zakaah that AH was able to pay for her medical care. At this time water penetrated her lung. Please keep this orphan in your du'a. Rany, AH worker in Cambodia visits Sima and supervises the payments for Sima's medical care.

The Smile of Dignity & Confidence

Sadly, shame and humiliation are associated with children who are born with cleft lips and cleft palates. The children are treated with scorn. Many children suffer low selfesteem and are hesitant to withstand the stares and silent reproof of the public. They are ashamed to be seen



by those outside of their close relations. When this is combined with poverty, it is devastating to the lives of these families. AH has donated money to make possible seventeen cleft lips surgeries so far this year (2015). Each surgery costs \$250. Please help us bring a bold, fearless smile to the poor, cleft-lip children in Bangladesh, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Iraq, Ethiopia, Sudan and Niger.

Orphans in Cambodia

Approximately three years AH has been assisting these orphans along with their two brothers and their mother. Sadly, their mother died in February 2015 and they were left in the care of a poor uncle. Sokheun, Sokayn and Saranh and their two brothers are now under the support of AH. Your Zakaah is their hope for a bright and safe future. When orphans are not cared for, they would roam the streets and garbage dump for food, causing them to be vulnerable to kidnapping, ill-treatment and sold to child labor. Please partner with us so that these five orphans are comforted knowing that they can rely on AH monthly financial help for food and clothing.



Orphans Education – A Brighter Future

Quite often, orphans in the public schools are stigmatized, teased and discriminated because they are living in the For example, a group of 22 high school orphanage. orphans in Guyana were attending public school and experienced embarrassing taunts and bullying. orphanage administration asked AH for a substantial monthly financial support to place these orphans in a private school. Al Hamdu lillah, in May 2015 AH began payments directly to the private school. This bold act of kindness for the orphans is in honor of AH mission of empowering the poor with dignity and respect. The cost per orphan is \$30. per month. Your Zakaah will help the orphans grow with confidence and give them hope to a brighter future. Prophet Muhammad (S), said: "I and the custodian of an orphan are like this (together) in Paradise", and he joined his forefinger and middle finger together. (Bukhari)

Monthly Financial Assistance Program in USA

One of AH mainstay programs is assistance to those in need here in the USA. It is our primary duty to take care of the poor at home first. Recipients are thoroughly screened before qualifying for assistance. They are given monthly financial assistance and others are being helped on an emergency basis. A few examples of these recipients are: a widow with two children, who recently had a heart by-pass surgery and too sick to return to work. Another case, is an elderly sister who roams through the garbage, picking up soda cans and bottles for cash in order to buy a chicken. A sister from NY called from the ER at the hospital that she does not have any money and needs a ride to the Homeless Shelter. With her pacemaker and crutches she was afraid of being left on the streets. AH sent her a taxi, money and a food package. Quite often AH is called upon to assist other organizations here in the USA to rescue people with emergency needs.

Thank You Letter From a University Student


Dear Amaana Hands Donors, Assalamu Alaikum
